SUMMARY STATEMENT

State v. Daniel Edward Ehrlick, Jr., Docket No. 39249

In an appeal from Ada County, the Supreme Court upheld Daniel Edward Ehrlick, Jr.'s convictions for first-degree murder and failure to report a death to law enforcement finding that the district court did not err by admitting certain evidence and that the prosecution did not violate Ehrlick's right to a fair trial by committing acts of prosecutorial misconduct. The Supreme Court found that the district court erred by admitting testimony from an expert witness regarding the credibility of witnesses, by allowing inadmissible hearsay from a witness and by permitting the prosecutor to question Ehrlick about a custody order in a case where he was not a party. The Court determined that the errors were harmless when considered individually and cumulatively.
