SUMMARY STATEMENT

Su Warren v. Williams & Parsons PC CPAS – Docket No. 41209

In an Idaho Industrial Commission (the Commission) case arising out of Kootenai County, the Idaho Supreme Court affirmed the Commission's decision. Su Warren sought worker's compensation benefits from her employer Williams & Parsons PC CPAS for injuries obtained during the course of her employment. The Commission determined that Warren had a permanent partial impairment (PPI) of 5% to the whole person and was entitled to temporary total disability and temporary partial disability benefits during the period of recovery through December 23, 2008, the date of maximum medical improvement. The Commission also determined that Warren failed to establish entitlement to medical care in the form of a pain management program, permanent partial disability in excess of PPI, retraining benefits, and attorney's fees. The Commission denied Warren's motion for reconsideration. Warren appealed to the Court, challenging the Commission's decisions and raising one evidentiary error. The Court affirmed the Commission's decision.
