## **SUMMARY STATEMENT**

Prehn v. Hodge, Docket No. 42465

In a case arising out of Ada County, the Idaho Supreme Court did not reverse the district court's decision not to consider the late-filed Joint Motion to Dismiss because Appellants failed to claim that the district court abused its discretion. Separately, the Idaho Supreme Court held that the district court did not err in finding that Hodge breached his fiduciary duty to Source 1 and its members by: (1) managing an asset auction in a misleading manner; (2) failing to minimize Source 1's expenses during dissolution; and (3) allowing Source 2 to acquire certain benefits from Source 1 without payment. Lastly, the Idaho Supreme Court found that the district court did not err in awarding attorney's fees to Source 1, Prehn, and Bandak. Costs and attorney's fees on appeal were awarded to Respondents.
