SUMMARY STATEMENT

Greenfield v. Smith, Docket. No. 43831

This is a legal malpractice case that addresses the statute of limitations applicable to professional malpractice claims, how a statute of limitations is calculated when the last day for filing a complaint falls on a Sunday, and whether expert testimony is necessary to establish the prima facie elements of legal malpractice. The Supreme held that the district court erred in its holding on the filing deadline of the statute of limitations for a legal malpractice claim, but that the district court properly granted summary judgment because Christina Greenfield had failed to disclose an expert witness within the required time.
