SUMMARY STATEMENT

State v. Jeske Docket No. 45989

The Idaho Supreme Court affirmed Jeffrey Allen Jeske's judgment of conviction for felony driving under the influence (DUI). On appeal, Jeske argued that the district court erred when it made two evidentiary rulings: (1) when it allowed the deputy prosecutor to comment on his refusal to consent to a blood draw to test it for alcohol; and (2) regarding testimony of uncharged misconduct. Jeske also alleged the district court erred when it allowed the State to amend the charges against him the morning of the trial and in refusing to give a requested jury instruction. Finally, Jeske asserted that the cumulative error doctrine requires this Court to vacate his conviction. Jeske appealed his judgment of conviction to the Court of Appeals, which affirmed his judgment of conviction. Jeske timely filed a petition for review, which this Court granted. The Idaho Supreme Court affirmed the judgment of conviction holding that there were no reversible errors below.
